


Governi ed imprese green nel nuovo contesto globale

Global emissions and the climate neutrality target









IPSOS has released the results of an international poll to understand citizens' support to the topic of climate change and the green recovery perspective during the pandemic.

In short, the poll shows that 71% of respondents worldwide agree that in the long-term climate change will be a crisis as dangerous as the Covid-19 pandemic and 68% believe the government would fail not addressing it immediately; 65% believe green economy is the key for the recovery from the crisis generated by Covid-19 and


57% say they would not vote for a political party whose program does not seriously address climate change.



CLIMATE APPEAL FROM THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY

Make European investments more fit for purpose to take up the challenge of achieving a sustainable ecological, climate and social transition

Dear members of the European Parliament, representatives of the Italian Government and members of parliament,

the transition towards an environmentally sustainable and climate neutral economy is a historic challenge which will change the energy system and the production and consumption models in all sectors. The stimulus packages for the recovery from the recession caused by the Covid-19 pandemic must, as has been reiterated at the European level, allocate an appropriate share of their funding to the substantial investments required for the transition towards carbon neutrality and must not damage the climate and the environment.

To achieve this, ahead of the negotiations on the final version of the European recovery package, which are due to take place in November, we urge you to support our call for the European climate and environment proposals to be made more incisive:

- 1. A climate ambition: to increase, from 37% to 50%, the amount of investments in the Recovery and Resilience Facility which is the most important funding instrument of the Next Generation EU package allocated to climate-friendly projects, both to cut emissions by 55% by 2030 and to achieve climate neutrality by 2050, as well as to contribute to the mobilisation of the climate and energy investments at European level, which will be in the order of 350 billion EUR per year according to European Commission estimates;
- 2. Climate criteria for the investments: the adoption of a clear methodology, similar to that defined by the European Regulation 2020/852 for the "sustainable finance taxonomy", to recognise climate-friendly investments;
- 3. An "exclusion list": the introduction of a list of economic activities which are not eligible to receive funding from the Recovery and Resilience Fund because they are not compatible with the efforts being made to cut emissions by 2030 and to achieve the objective of carbon neutrality by 2050.

If not now, when? The time has come to make the right choices and to assume our responsibilities!

In order to achieve the shared objective of tackling the current serious climate crisis, we call for the adoption of credible measures which receive the appropriate level of funding.
